

Red Hall Local Nature Reserve

Route 4 - 20 Minutes / 0.6 Miles

A flat and easily accessible walk around ponds.

About the route

This walk is set within a small nature reserve situated on the outskirts of Red Hall.

This walk is mainly flat with surfaced paths, making it easy to access.

The area consists of grasslands, one large pond and several smaller ponds which are pleasant to walk around in all seasons.

The nature reserve is home to fish such as Roach and Rudd which can be seen from the fishing platforms.

Walking instructions

Start at the path between the houses on Aviemore Court (behind bus stop on Coombe Drive).

1 Keep left until you reach the path on the right which leads to the nature reserve.

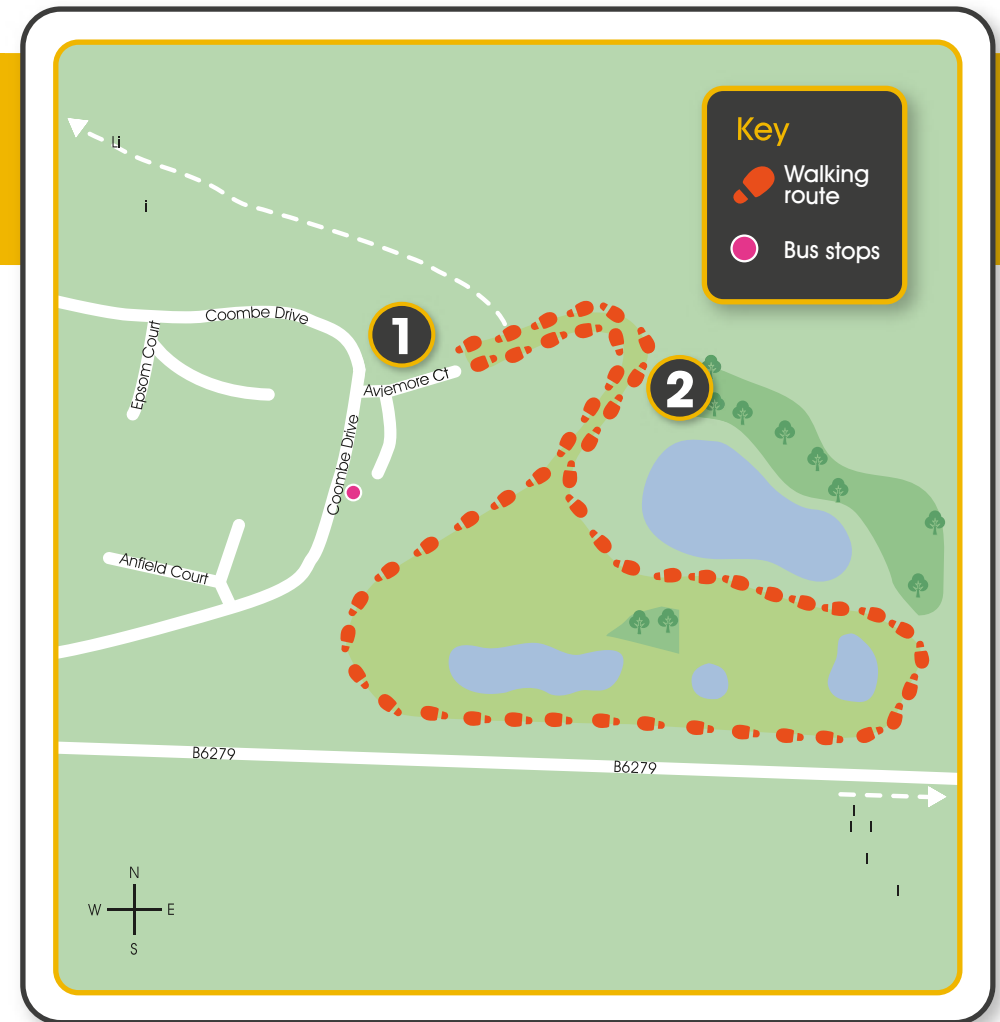
2 Enter the gate and follow the path around the ponds.

Things to see

Within the grassland area of the reserve there is a variety of wildlife that can be seen such as the 6 Spot Burnet Moth, the Common Blue Butterfly and the Great Spotted Woodpecker.

The area also has many trees and a variety of flowering plants such as Common Knapweed.

You may also catch sight of Black Tailed Skimmer and Branded Demoiselle Dragonflies over the ponds.



Health & safety

Wear appropriate clothing and footwear for the weather. Be careful near ponds and keep children away from the edge.

This route links to

- Red Hall & Great Burdon Loop (Route 3).
- South Burdon Community Woodland.
- The Whinnies & Middleton St George Water Park (Route 5) via South Burden Woods.
- This walk is close to bus route 11.
